

Whats is the legend about?

The Yeti or Abominable Snowman (or Jigou for the Himalayan Tibetans) could be a cryptide interpreted as a giant ape related to the Big Foot, the Yowie in Australia, the Kunk in the Andes and other similar myths present in numerous cultures.

The traditional tales of the Himalayan region refer to the Yeti as a spirit of the glacier that brought fortune to the hunters, or as a creature that frightened people so that they did not venture too much into the mountains.



Where does the legend come from?

The legends of the Yeti originated in the folklore of the ancestors of the Himalayan people in 1958. A local newspaper in Northern California, published a report about the discovery of giant and mysterious footprints near Bluff Creek, California. Over the years, there have been numerous reports, sightings, and evidence claiming to prove its existence. However, DNA tests have repeated proven that findings are actually either wild or domestic animal or human remains.



How does Yeti Looks Like?

It is a being similar to an ape which is 2 meters tall, has a white and long fur, has great musculature and feeds on small mammals, birds, insects and according to some versions of the legend it can also feed on those humans who dare to enter its territory.

Of evidence, there are only stories that describe it as a bipedal giant ape that is believed to be located in the wooded areas of the Himalayan mountain range, but other sources indicate that it could be a variety of wooly albo bear similar to the polar bear.
